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# Message from AIHA to Local Section and Volunteer Group Leaders

In the fall of 2009, the AIHA Board of Directors began the process of developing a new strategic plan for the association to carry us through the next five years. That effort culminated at the 2010 Board strategic planning meeting held this past July. Representatives from the Academy of Industrial Hygiene, the American Industrial Hygiene Foundation, Local Sections and ABIH were included throughout the process, making for a cohesive and inclusive plan that will guide our efforts in the coming years.

The AIHA 2011-2015 strategic plan can be found on our Web site at. Please use the strategic goals and associated priorities defined in the strategic plan to help guide your volunteer group priorities and efforts.

In addition to the new strategic plan there were several other important outcomes from the meeting:

- 1. We developed a new mission statement that is concise and easily understood: "Creating Knowledge to Protect Worker Health." We also developed a new vision statement that I think truly inspires us to action: "Elimination of Workplace Illnesses."
- 2. We revised the AIHA Core Values as follows:
  - Prevention of illnesses and injuries
  - Advocacy and development of sciencebased policy and practice
  - Respect for workers and communities

- Support for employers and employees
- Respect for our members

The full description of each of the revised values is included in the strategic plan.

As I noted in my President's Message in the September issue of *The Synergist*, one of the most important outcomes of the meeting was coming to consensus that industrial hygiene is an exposure risk assessment and management discipline under the umbrella of public health.

We have also taken a major step in moving forward our strategic priorities with the formation of four project teams:

 Core Competencies – Led by Gayla McCluskey and Perry Logan from the Academy

- Membership and Local Sections – Led by Dan Anna, AIHA Secretary-Elect
- International Led by Alan Leibowitz and Charles Redinger, AIHA Board of Directors
- Programs, Products, Services, and Activities Review – Led by Harry Beaulieu, AIHA Treasurer You will be hearing more about the work of these project teams in the future.

I look forward to building on the energy and momentum we have created and to working with our Local Sections and Volunteer Groups to translate this new plan into action.

#### **OSHA Distracted Driving Initiative**

President Obama has issued an Executive Order prohibiting federal employees from texting while driving. 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### **GLS Represented at Geology Expo**

GLS board members Pat Brogan and Barb Epstien participated in the Georgia Geological Society's Environmental Geology & Hydrogeology expo on October 9, held outdoors at Tellus Science Museum in Cartersville. They prepared and distributed a fact sheet on exposure hazards and other health & safety concerns encountered during environmental testing

and remediation work to 130 professional geologists and geology students attending the event. The event included demonstrations of various drilling techniques for testing and analysis of soil and groundwater contamination, field sampling equipment, and site remediation technologies.

## New Georgia Tech Spanish Language Training Materials for Construction Workers

The Safety and Health Consultation Program at Georgia Tech has recently completed a number of training materials intended primarily for small construction contractors whose native language is Spanish. In this project, the Georgia Tech staff was assisted by Juan Carlos Rodriguez, a bilingual OSHA Outreach Trainer with over 20 years of experience in construction safety, and by

William Carvajal, an interpreter licensed by the State of Georgia. The training features short movie clips that have been uploaded to the Georgia Consultation Program's new YouTube channel "OSHAInfoGATech."

#### \*\*Important TeleWeb Certification Information

This TeleWeb will be ABIH approved for 0.42 IH certification maintenance (CM) points, has been awarded 0.25 continuance of certification (COCs) points and provides 0.25 continuing education units (CEUs).

The Distance Learning Program works with our accrediting bodies to insure compliance with all policies and (ANSI) standards. Please note the following information pertaining to participation verification and the continuing education. AIHA requires a final exam be completed for all Distance Learning Courses.

A \$35 processing fee is required for exam processing, participation verification, record retention and educational transcripts. All educational transcripts (certificates of completion) will be available for download from AIHA's Web site 3-4 weeks after the TeleWeb. All transcripts will issue CM, CEU and COC points. Materials sent after these dates will not be accepted.

- Live TeleWeb—Exams must be postmarked within TWO MONTHS of the TeleWeb.
- Archive TeleWeb Downloads—Exams must be postmarked within TWO MONTH of the date of purchase.
- Local Sections—Please contact AIHA's Distance Learning Program Manager Cinthia Minan (Cminan@aiha.org) for a submission deadline.

Final exams will be scored as follows:

- 70% > will receive course credits awarding CM points, COCs, and CEUs.
- 69% < will be notified of their score and made aware of their options directly.

Allow 3-4 weeks for processing and notification of course status. Exams will not be returned.
